





 JUNE 16, 1862



The center of the 8th's line was shattered by a round of canister from an 8 in. Columbiad. However, the right companies of the 8th continued forward and hit the (their) right of the Tower Battery.


Tower Battery (Fort Lamar) is defended by 1 SC, 9 SC, 22 SC, 4 LA and 1 SC Artillery (6 guns).




