1. New OCRM Permit Review Process

The Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) of South Carolina DHEC has initiated a revised review process for permits and other federal actions in the coastal zone. As a response to this revised process, the SHPO is issuing new requirements and guidance for consulting with our office for OCRM Coastal Zone Certification of permits and other federal actions.
