### **2. Archsite Map Requirement Clarification for Section 106 Project Review**

Our office will accept an Archsite map or any *equivalent* map that identifies known historic properties.

### **3. New Guidance on Native American Section 106 Consultation**

The Advisory Council on Historic Preservation announces the publication of new guidance, *Limitations on the Delegation of Authority by Federal Agencies to Initiate Tribal Consultation Under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act*. The guidance clarifies that “the authorization to applicants to initiate Section 106 consultation does not apply to the initiation of consultation with Indian tribes unless expressly authorized by the Indian tribe to do so.” A copy of the guidance is available on the ACHP’s website at <http://www.achp.gov/delegationmemo-final-7-1-11.pdf>.
